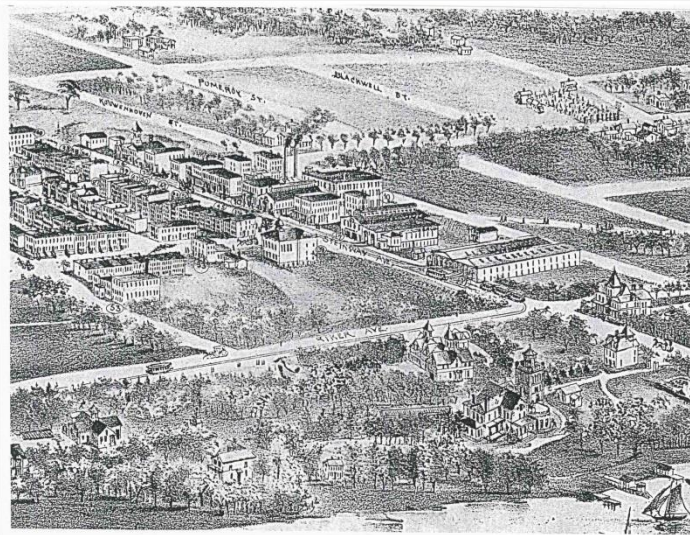


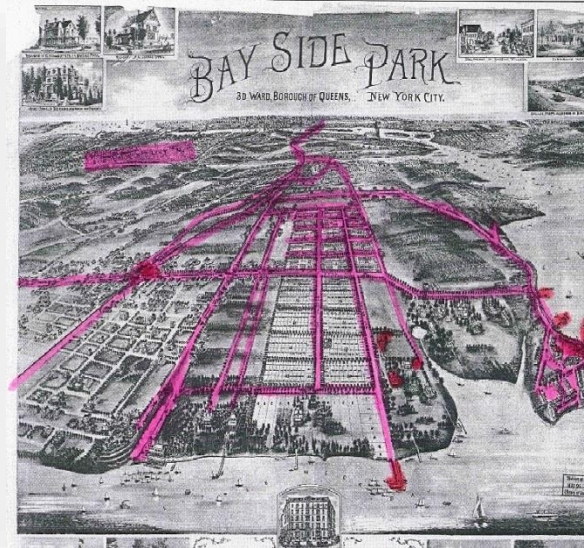

Steinway Settlement



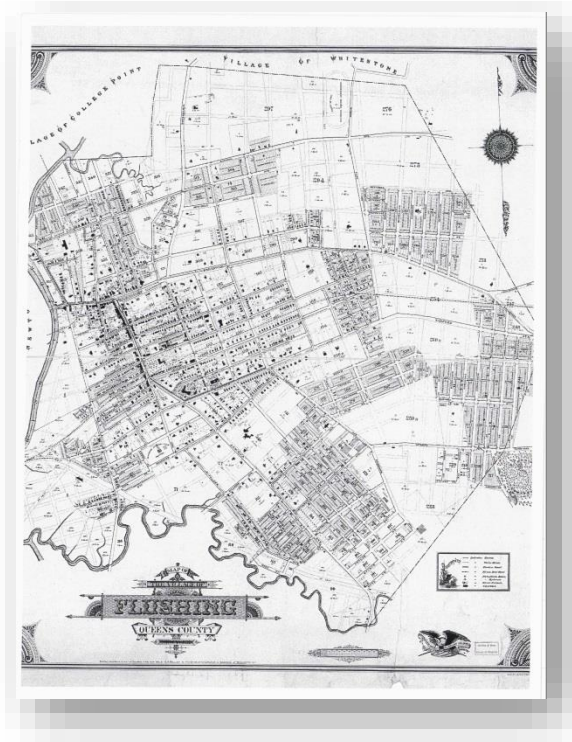
Bayside – with streets scored



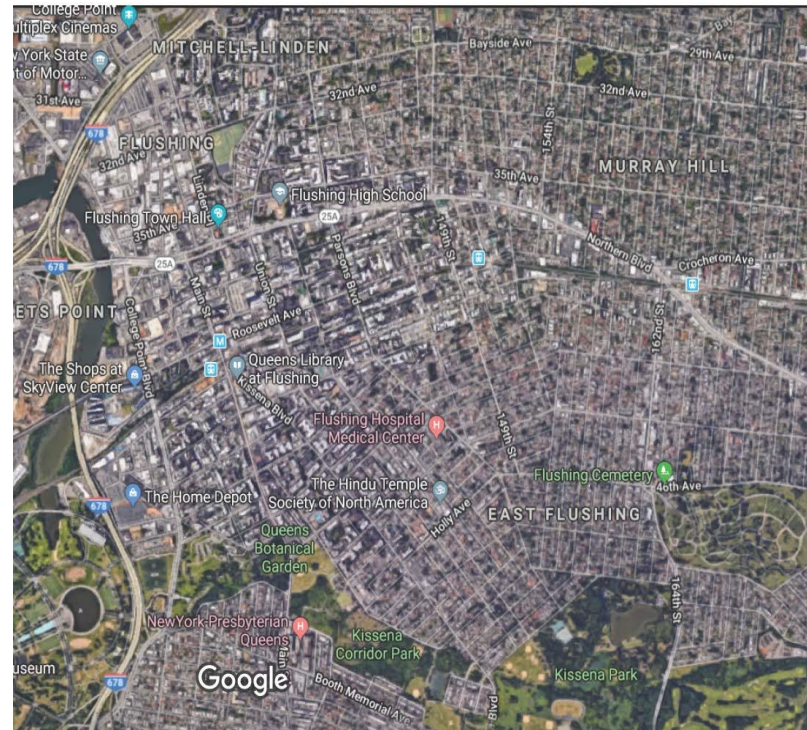
Have students compare historic maps with Google Earth – mark out blocks with superimposing modern streets.

Flushing Buildings - 1894



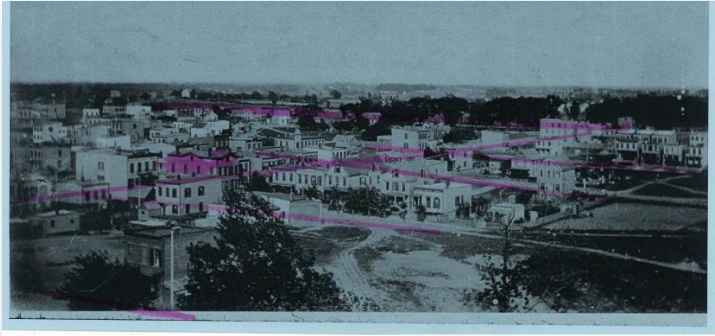
Flushing Buildings – 2018

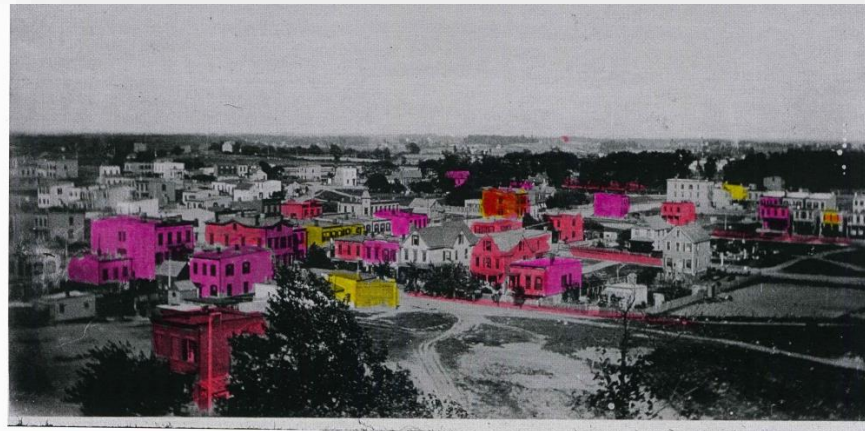

Buildings discovered in study area



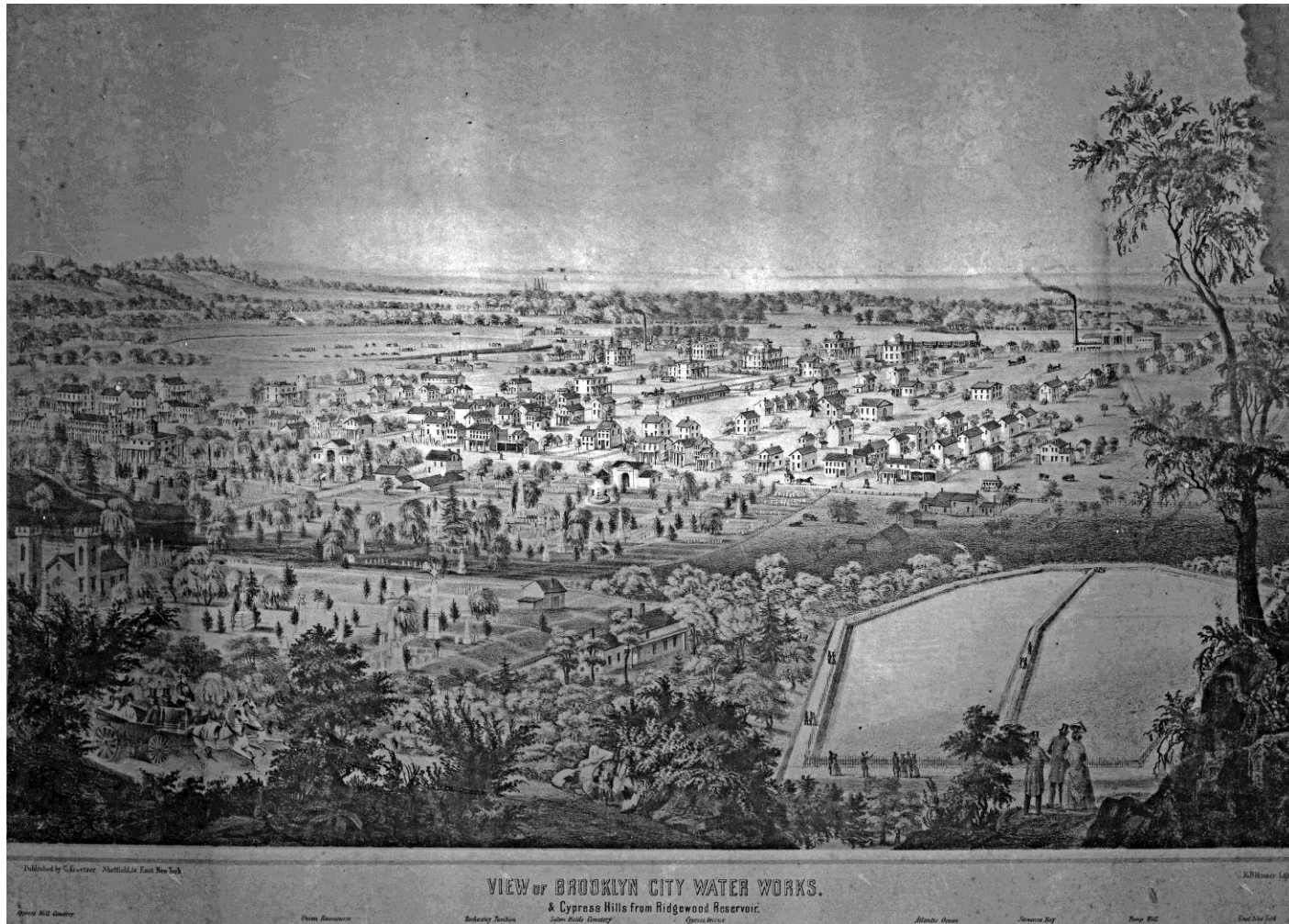

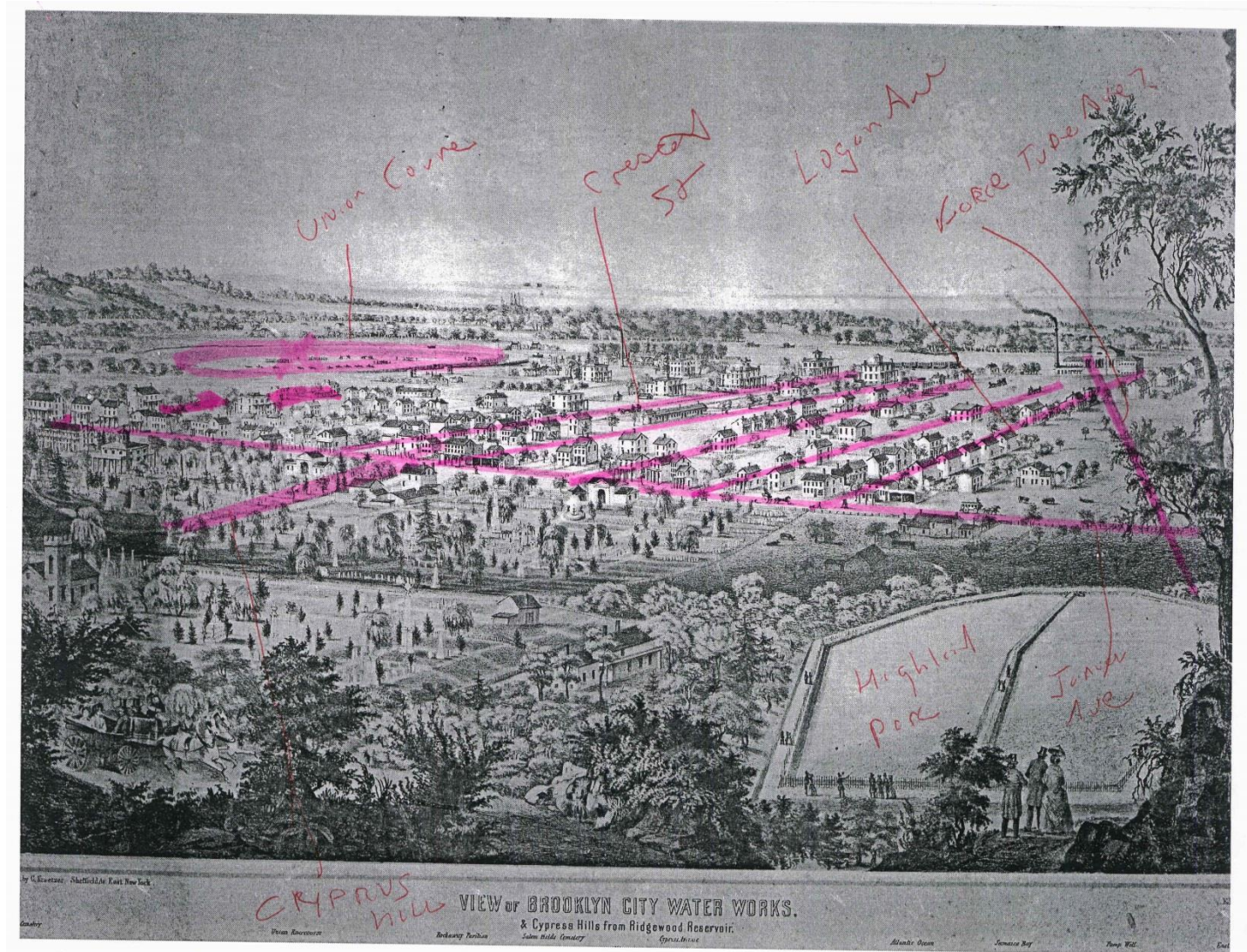

Exhibit 4# Neighborhood Surveys – Step by Step

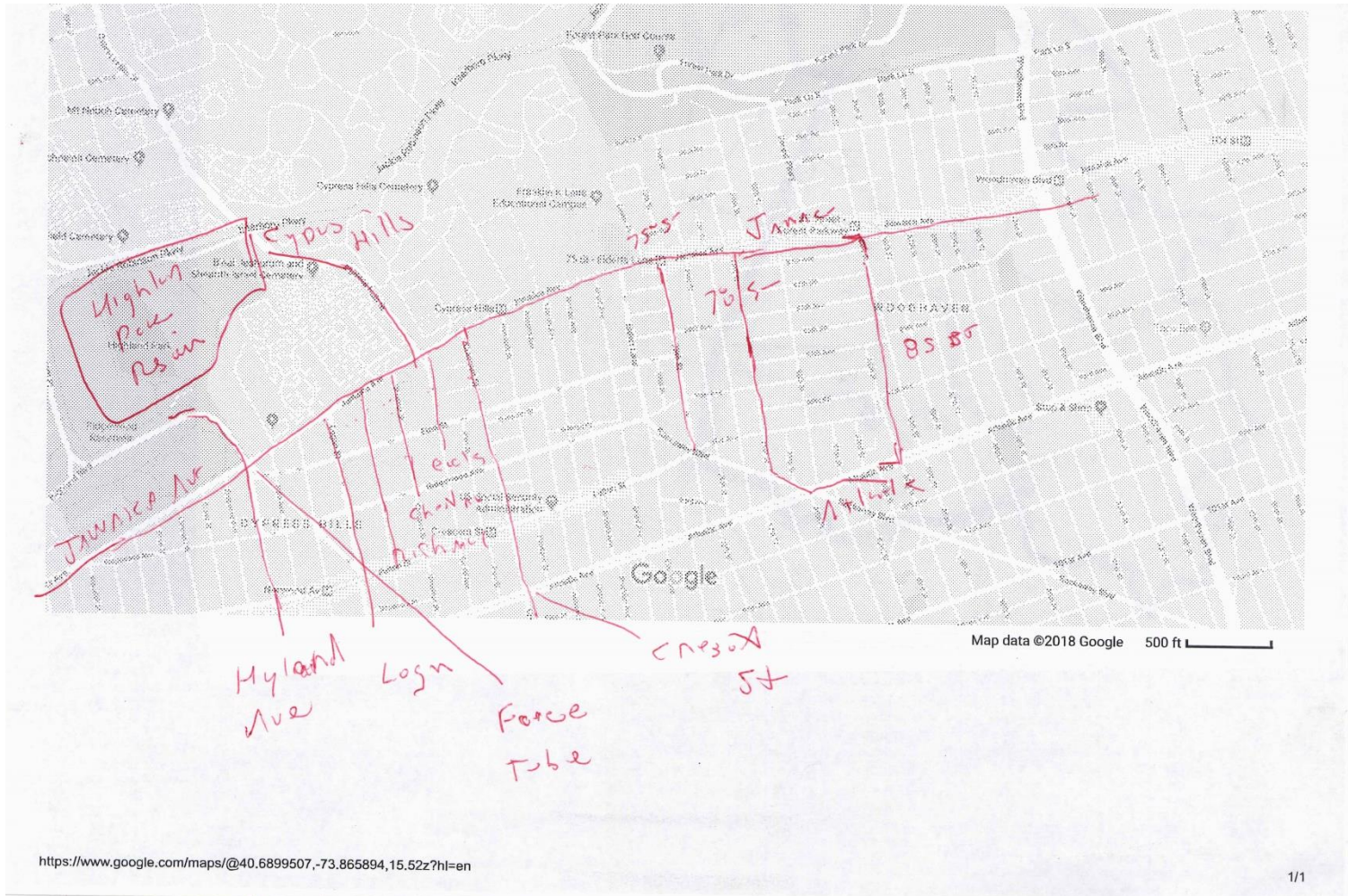
Step 1: Historic Image (Ridgewood Reservoir 1859)
